

My French Learning Journey

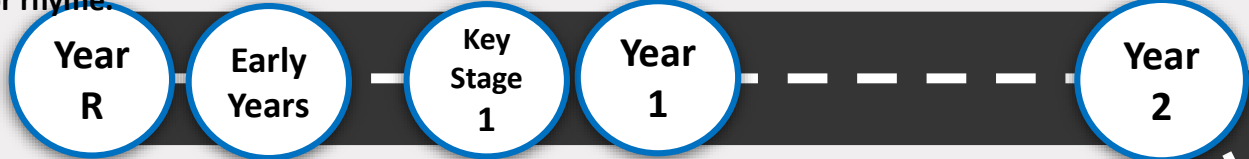


Early years:

I can say a few important words (hello/goodbye/thank-you).
I can listen & join in with some parts of a song or rhyme.

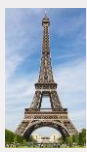


I can listen to & enjoy a story.
I can say my name & how I am feeling.
I am starting to recognise important words written in French (e.g. numbers).



I can identify accurately some sounds in French.
I can say a sequence of items e.g. several numbers or colours.
I can recognize important words written in French e.g. days of the week/numbers/greetings.
I can attempt to copy some important words written in French e.g. greetings or a number/day of the week.

I can understand a range of familiar spoken phrases.
I can ask & answer simple questions & give basic information.
I can understand simple written phrases.
I can spell some familiar written words & phrases accurately.



I can understand a few familiar spoken words & phrases.
I can say/repeat a few words & short simple phrases.
I can recognize & read out a few familiar words.
I can write or copy a few simple words.

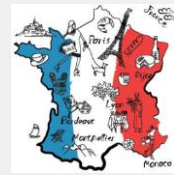


French Skills:

KS2 French:
